Solomon Wright Grave Dedication

Plans for the chapter's Solomon Wright Grave Dedication program on 14 October in Henry County are progressing well. Committee Chairman Mark Steetle reports that members of the chapter have visited the Wright's Chapel Cemetery a couple of times and have made a good start towards some general clean up. For those who have not had an opportunity to help with "tree cuttin' and weed wackin", Mark has indicated that much more work is needed prior to October. The ladies of the War of 1812 have committed to taking part in the program, and the SCV have also been contacted about participating. The Henry County Commission have been approached about declaring 14 October "Solomon Wright Day" in Henry County, and the Henry County Historical Society wants to be involved. The Alabama Cemetery Preservation Alliance is on board to participate and through their efforts The Wright's Chapel Cemetery has been placed on the Alabama Historic Cemetery Register. A certificate to this effect is being prepared for presentation at the program. Color Guard participation is expected from Florida, Mississippi and several of the chapters here in Alabama. Work continues in trying to develop a list of Wright descendants within the local area, while descendants living in Mississippi and possibly Texas will be attending. This is shaping up to be an outstanding program, and everyone is encouraged to mark their calendar now.

116th Congress

Despite the Texas size heat, delegates and guests to the 116th Congress in Dallas were treated to true Texas hospitality ranging from a BBQ to the opportunity to attend a rodeo along with tours of both Dallas and Fort Worth. Ten ALSSAR compatriots and seven ladies represented our state at the meeting which saw Nathan E. White, Jr. installed as our new President General. PG White is no stranger to Alabama as he is a dual member with our society and a member of the Tennessee Valley Chapter. In the only contested race for a General Officer position, Chuck Bragg (IN) was elected Genealogist General. He likewise is a dual member of the Alabama Society. Hunter McDonald (TNSSAR) was installed as the new VPG of the Southern District.

The work of the Alabama Society was recognized at the Congress with the ALSSAR being awarded an Officer Flag Streamer for having the president and trustee at the last three national meetings; a Theodore Roosevelt certificate for involvement with the Blue Star Salute Program; a C.A.R. certificate noting the society's work with the Children of the American Revolution and the Howard F. Horne, Jr Award for having the largest increase in GW fellows based on membership. In addition to a streamer, this last award came with a \$500.00 check

General Galvez Marker

On Sunday September 17th, from 2 - 4 PM there will be the rededication of a Revolutionary War Patriot's grave along with the dedication of a Historic Marker at the Harpersville Garden of Memories Burial Grounds. Descendants of Boz Shepard, professed to be the "Last Creek Indian Chief of the Kewahatchie Tribe" are intending to install a memorial marker to the Shepard family. Color guard help has been requested from both the Tri-State and the Wiregrass Chapters. This should be a great event so mark your calendar now and plan to attend.
